*Architecture*- -Welcome back everyone and a bigger welcome to the class of 2008/9.

- This is a VERY big year for the School of Architecture so expect MANY great things to come from the School.

-Reed Kroloff will assume his position as new dean of the School of Architecture on October 1,2004. He is currently wrapping up his prior commitments with his design firm but has been in and out of New Orleans for the past month. Previously, Dean Kroloff was Assistant Professor of Architecture and the Humanities at Arizona State University in Tempe, Arizona. At ASU, he also served as assistant dean of the College of Architecture and Environmental Design, and was granted the Arizona Chapter of the American Institute of Architects' first Outstanding Educator Award. While in Arizona, Mr. Kroloff was the architecture critic at the Arizona Republic, the state's largest newspaper. He has also written for other regional and national publications, ranging from Metropolis to Places. Reed Kroloff has worked for Architecture firms in Arizona and Texas, and holds degrees from Yale University and the University of Texas at Austin. He is regarded as one of the strongest critics of architecture and has been selected many times to jury architectural competitions around the world.

-The Student Organizations of the School of Architecture have worked hard over the summer to collaborate their efforts to aid in each of their goals and ambitions. Representatives from the Architecture Student Government, American Institute of Architecture Students, Alpha Rho Chi
