Some students learned to play the traditional Native American game chunkey, while others were given a demonstration on stone tool making before practicing making traditional ceramics. The students also enjoyed working on the traditionally built palisade which will be part of the 16th century living history exhibit the EJF is constructing at Catawba Meadows.
