Registers of births, deaths, marriages and of Holy Communion, Constitution of the Orphans Society, copybook of letters, and and other documents make up this collection.

Three early ministers , G. Modinger (1856-1869), Christian G. Modinger (1870-1880), and Gottfried J. Wegener (1889-1930) kept the records of this church now known as St. Paul's Lutheran Church located at 2624 Burgundy Street in New Orleans. It was founded in 1849.
