Drawings and photographic prints by architect Emilio Levy (1881-1958). Levy graduated from Tulane with a B.E. in architectural engineering in 1902. He practiced in New York City. Most of the drawings date to Levy's period of study at the Ecole des Beaux Arts in Paris, 1907-1910. Drawings include typical atelier sketch problems and sketches of historic European buildings and details. Photographs show European monuments. Most photographs were apparently taken by Levy. A few others were professionally taken.

PROVENANCE

European sketches and some of the photographs of European architecture comprised an exhibit held in the Tulane School of Architecture in the 1950's. The sketches and photographs were left to the school and later transferred to Special Collections, Howard-Tilton Library. Other items were given to Tulane ca. 1973 by a relative of Levy.
