## REPORT.

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*To the Honorable the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Louisiana, in General Assembly convened:*

The Administrators of the Charity Hospital of the City of New Orleans beg leave to submit to your consideration the following statement of their affairs :

The number of patients admitted into the Charity Hospital during the year 1860, was.....	14,000
Of which were discharged .....	12,357
Died .....	1,390
Remaining in the Hospital.....	891

In our former reports to your honorable body, we commented upon the annual increase in the number of patients. The returns of this year show an increase of nearly two thousand patients to whom relief was administered in the hospital during the year 1860 over that of 1859.

Standing at the outlet of the largest commerce which floats upon any river on the continent, the duty is forced upon us of providing for thousands whom the crowded avenues of travel and commerce have thrown upon us as the victims of accident and disease.

From the statement of the Finance Committee, hereto annexed, it will appear that the balance in the hands of the Treasurer on the 1st of January, 1860, was \$1,829 80; the disbursements during the year 1860 have been \$70,853 38; and the balance on hand on the first day of January, 1861, was \$4,492 82.

The debts of this institution amount to upward of \$30,000, upon contracts for annual supplies, such as bread, meat, drugs, fuel, etc.,

independent of expenses incurred for repairs to the main building of the hospital, and for the erection of new buildings, which amount \$15,500 more.

To supply the necessary wants of this institution, reliance must be placed principally upon direct aid from the State Treasury. The tax on emigrants, which formerly furnished almost a sufficient fund to pay the entire expenses of the hospital, has fallen off from \$76,000 to \$16,300. The amount received during the last year from other sources of revenue has been directed by Legislature from the support of the hospital to other purposes, doubtless useful and necessary, but to the diminution of our means of support.

We respectfully ask for the usual appropriations necessary for the support of the institution during the coming year, and that the necessary expenses incurred in the repairs of the hospital, and in the erection of two new buildings, be made the object of a special appropriation.

## OBSERVATIONS.

In some instances the number of discharges and deaths will exceed the number of admissions, and *vice versa*. This proceeds from the patients having several diseases at the time of their entrance, and, therefore, of their having been discharged cured, or dying of a different disease from that which they had on being admitted. Also, they frequently contract new diseases in the house, for which they are subsequently treated, and finally discharged.

I may also mention when the discharges or deaths exceed the number of admissions, it may be owing to the number of patients who are remaining in the hospital, at the end of the last year, who have since mostly all died or have been discharged, and *vice versa*.

Many patients are admitted, among whom rank children, either at the breast, or too young to be separated from their mother, who when examined by the physicians, are declared not sick. There are also applicants for admissions, who, after being examined in the

ward by the physicians, are pronounced not sick. They consequently appear in my report under the denomination of *Nothing*.

Others leave the hospital, or die previous to the visit of the physicians, many also ran away, carrying their tickets with them, their disease having not been ascertained. They, consequently, are reported in our Tableau as Uncertain or Unknown.
