SCAMeL Speedy Startup 2021 Spirituality Training in the Health Sciences Amy Faltinek Senior Director, Technical Services Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center

Project description

The goal of this project is to add spirituality training to the continuing education opportunities at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center (TTUHSC). Spirituality is important to patient care because its inclusion in the patient-provider relationship makes for improved whole-person care. This project will require the four TTUHSC employees listed below to complete a Certificate in Spirituality, Health, and Healing through Harvard Community Education. The certificate is 25 contact hours over 6 weeks and the outcome is for the learner to describe the characteristics of spirituality, the connection between spirituality and healing, and the essential elements of spirituality. The information will be condensed and shared as an elective/continuing education unit with all TTUHSC and University Medical Center (UMC) employees (faculty, staff, students, and providers) who are interested. Once completed, interview and survey data will be collected from participants, resulting in original research.

Importance

Spirituality in patient care can enhance patient and provider wellness by incorporating a whole-person perspective into the patient-provider relationship, but also relationships between other stakeholders such as employees, students, etc. It brings people together and connects them as a result of getting to know each other at a deeper level. It also helps with grounding and addresses burnout. Addressing spiritual backgrounds and needs is a crucial, but often overlooked aspect of managing institutional and patient diversity. For all these reasons, it can be argued that the inclusion of spirituality into institutional culture is an ethical requirement in healthcare workplaces.
